A1: Worst mass shooting in U.S. history

Dozens killed hundreds injured as lone gunman opens fire with automatic weapons in Las Vegas

Nationwide shock and grief have given way to soul searching over the worst mass shooting in US history after a lone gunman opened fire on revelers at a country music festival on the Las Vegas Strip yesterday, killing at least 50 and injuring more than 400.

The 64-year-old gunman, identified as Nevada resident Stephen Paddock, picked his targets at the open-air concert from his room on the 32nd floor of the Mandalay Bay hotel before killing himself as officers stormed the room, police said.

A3: Hong Kong's youth shows little interest in policymaking

Ongoing consultation finds many are instead caught up with problems at work or school.

Most young people have little interest in the Hong Kong government's plans to involve them in policymaking because they are preoccupied with other problems at school or work, according to the initial findings of a youth policy consultation.

Commission on Youth chairman Lau Ming-wai, who is leading the consultation exercise to carve out a new youth policy, described the findings as "troubling", as it showed the gap between the city's youth and the government.
