



A1 Travellers pounce on Cathay ticket glitch

Cathay Pacific Airways has sold first and business class tickets at economy price in what appears to have been an error.

Frequent fliers and bargain hunters alike snapped up tickets quickly in the new year as word spread on social media and flight blogging websites and forums.

The airline offered return business and first class seats from Vietnam to North America at just HK\$5,300 and HK\$6,600, respectively. The airfares have since been withdrawn from its website.

A1 Lower turnout for New Year's Day rally

Thousands of protesters took to the streets of Hong Kong to air their grievances against the government in yesterday's annual New Year's Day rally, this time with pro-independence activists complaining of harassment and restrictions.

Dozens of activists calling for the city's separation from China took part, but broke off from the main march and did not enter the public forecourt at the government's headquarters in Admiralty where it ended, having been warned off in advance.

North Korean leader Kim Jong-un has renewed a pledge to denuclearize the Korean peninsula despite stalled negotiations with the US, but warned that he could just as quickly resume his nuclear weapons programme if sanctions are not lifted.

"It is my firm willingness to achieve a permanent peace regime and the denuclearisation of the Korean peninsula," Kim said in his New Year's Day speech yesterday.
